Youth World Cup

Next year is a very busy year for international touch competition. In January the Inaugural Youth World Cup is being contested in Auckland.

Thirty (30) teams will be playing for the coveted trophy and tile of the Best Youth Touch Country in the world. We wish the Aussie good luck.

World Club Masters

In July 2001 the Second World Master Club Championships are being held in Singapore. It is open to all teams from anywhere in the world who meet the age criteria.



The tournament is open for age categories from 30 years – in 5 year increments – to 50 years and over.

The divisions available are men, women and mixed in all age groups. The tournament will be held from 23rd July to 29th July.

Can a referee allow a quick tap to be taken before he indicates the mark?

Rule 15 Player Note A states; "..... a player may take a quick tap providing the referee acknowledges such a request and providing the tap is taken at or beyond the correct mark"
